ARRL EC-001 course

ARRL EC-001 Emergency Communications Course

If you need to take the ARRL Emergency Communications Course (EC-001) Stanislaus ARES can help. The EC-001 workbook is out of print, however The Indian River County ARES has all of the study information (including test and answers) posted on their web site. Recent amateurs who have taken the test have printed out the test questions and answers and have studied like they would for a ham cram. Pass rate has been about 100 percent.

The ARRL has updated this course. There are some content differences, however members who have used this to prepare for the challenge exam have been successful.

Here is the web site to study for the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications Course challenge examination (EC-001):

Go to www.ircares.org This is the web site for the Indian River County ARES. Once you are on the web site click on the training and reference tab. Then click on the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications (EC-001) tab. That will take you to the course information.

Once you complete this on-line study you can arrange with Stanislaus ARES to take the ARRL test. We generally give the test at a ham cram session or before or after the monthly ARES meeting. Please e-mail Pat KG6JXZ at kg6jxz@charter.net, or Lucian KF6NPG at kf6npg@aol.com or John K6JRO at k6jro@arrl.net to arrange to take the test. *There is a \$15.00 test administration fee payable to ARRL.*

You can also access the updated ARRL EC-001 course at the ARRL website. Go to www.arrl.org. Once there click on the licensing, education and training tab. Then click on the online course catalog tab and



look for the EC-001 course. It states that it takes about 45 hours to complete the course over 9 weeks. Once you complete the ARRL course you can take the exam online. From what I can see there is no charge to take the course or exam. You have to take the course before you can take the exam.

You cannot take the challenge exam online.

Featured Article

Parks on the Air (POTA) Activation of K-0210

Brief History

In 2016, the American Radio Relay League (ARRL) in collaboration with the National Park Service (NPS) launched a year-long promotion called National Parks on the Air (NPOTA) to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the founding of the National Park Service by President Theodore Roosevelt. The objective was to promote the NPS and showcase Amateur Radio to the public. In January 2016 members of the Stanislaus Amateur Radio Association (SARA) participated in this centennial event with the activated of the Rosie the Riveter National Historical Park museum in Richmond, CA.

The attention and success (not to mention the fun) generated by NPOTA prompted a group of hams led by Jason Johnston, W3AAX to continue the event indefinitely as Parks on the Air (POTA). The objective of POTA is to encourage licensed amateur radio operators to operate temporarily from, and bring more visibility, awareness, and appreciation to national and state/province level parks. This also includes national monuments, national preserves, wildlife refuges, wetland management districts, national wild and scenic rivers systems, wildlife management areas, antarctic stations, national military parks, and historical trails. Hams, known as activators, set up at

parks and make contacts (work) with amateurs know as hunters. Points are awarded to the activator for operating from a park, and to each of the hunters contacting or working, the activator. Additional information, including official rules, can be found at www.parksontheair.com.

Prompted by our passion for contesting and radio sport, Bill Danforth, AE6J, Brendon Church, NK6M and John Otte, K6JRO founded Central Valley Amateur Radio Euthenists, N6OOA. On March 14th we activated the San

We arrived at 10am and began to set up our station. We were fortunate to find shaded picnic tables among the brush. Our station consisted of an ICOM 7300 and a Gap mono-ban vertical 20m antenna. Power was supplied by a Bioenno 12v 60Ah battery. We used N3FJP logging software with dual monitors. This allowed both the operator and scribe to see logging simultaneously. By 11am we had settled in and were ready to go.



While we started out slow, within an hour we were managing pileups! We stayed in the General portion of 20m concentrating most efforts around 14.325 Mhz. We all took turns operating the radio, scribing, and managing. A special thanks to Gary, WA6UXA who provided us with our only Stanislaus County contact.

Joaquin River National Wildlife Refuge (K-0210) in Vernalis for POTA. The Refuge is situated at the confluence of three major riversthe Tuolumne, Stanislaus, and San Joaquin— in the San Joaquin Valley, creating a mosaic of habitats which provide ideal conditions for wildlife and plant diversity. The park had been activated twice in the past four months resulting in 202 contacts. Bill, AE6J was determined to surpass this—and we did!

The park had a steady flow of visitors (including Jason, KA6TIO) with several inquiries about our operation. Bill, AE6J graciously put on his PIO hat and introduced curious onlookers to our operation.


In the end, we surpassed our wildest expectations. Within five hours, we made 222 contacts (phone) including four countries and worked 49 states and Canadian Provinces. Special QSL card were printed for this activation. Final stats are below:
