President Mark, N6ARP, called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, welcomed everyone and asked Scott, KN6OOV, to lead the Pledge of Allegiance. There were 22 members, and three guests present according to the sign-in sheet. Mark asked members and guests to introduce themselves.

Reading of Minutes: Secretary Scott Griffin, N6CIC, reported the Readout with the minutes that had been e-mailed out to the membership prior to the meeting. There were no changes or corrections. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Eva, KM6BIP, with a second by John, W6PY. The club approved the minutes unanimously.

President Mark, N6ARP, noted next month is the holiday meeting, so please bring a dessert to share.

Vice-President Scott Daniels, KN6OOV, noted that today's presentation will be by Mark, N6ARP, on DMR following the nominations for club officers and board members.

Treasurer Scott Johnson, KN6RKY, read the current treasurer's report. A copy is attached to the minutes and will be included in the next Readout. Lucian, KF6NPG, made a motion to accept the report. After a second by Robin, KG6ZYQ, the club approved the treasurer's report. Scott reported the club now has 84 paid members, and he is accepting dues payments for the year 2025. One can also go to the web page to pay dues. He noted that the split-the-pot funds will go 50% to the equipment fund and 50% to the general fund in 2025.

Sergeant at Arms Herb, W9CMX, was not present.

Club Trustee Lucian, KF6NPG, reported he has received no equipment complaints, and the repeater system is working as it should. At Mt. Oso there were two Public Safety Power Shutdowns since our last meeting. One

on October 17 for almost two days, and one on November 5 for almost 24 hours.

Patrick, KG6AZZ, and Lucian went to Mt. Oso on Saturday, November 2. We thank Mark, N6ARP, and Scott, KN6RKY, for having painted the building door grey. The building was fairly clean, and mouse droppings were swept and the mouse bait topped up.

It appears the battery for the two-meter repeater will provide service for about 24 hours under normal use. We expected longer service. We have also learned the 440 repeater did not work under battery power.

The following electrical work was down while Lucian and Patrick were on site. We thank Scott, KN6OOV, for providing wire, zip ties, and labels for this work:

- Repaired battery connections to the 440 repeater which now works on battery power.
- Installed a Rig Runner power distribution box in the 440 cabinet.
- The 440, 220, and 6-meter repeaters will work off the Rig Runner attached to the Battleborn battery.
- Additional connections were added to the controller which is now powered by either the Battleborn or Dakota batteries.
- All connections were labeled, and tabs were placed on critical connections to keep them tight.
- The Powergate charging the Dakota battery will not allow a full charge. Next visit we will bring a laptop for some adjustments.

The electricity bill at \$76.15 was a little lower than last month possibly due to a shutdown and shorter billing days. It appears our power costs have stabilized in the \$70-80+ range.

Future Projects:

- Solar charging plan with a target for next spring (see the proposed plan on the web site).
- Removing unused equipment, and hauling brush off the site.
- Installing an exhaust fan in the building.
- Testing of the linked 2-meter and 220 repeaters to get more traffic on 220.

Board Member: Jason, KA6TIO, was present: no report.

ARES: the next meeting will be on Saturday, Dec. 14, and plans for 2025 will be discussed.

New Business: new member, Roger, W6PKV, introduced himself and gave some background. He has been licensed since 1952; he is a physicist/nuclear physicist and worked at Stanford University. He was present on the Marshall Islands for the atomic tests. He is an avid CW operator and DXer and had a station in Redwood City. Welcome Roger!

Break:

There was a 15-minute break. The Split-the-Pot raffle raised \$58. John, W6PY, was the lucky winner and he returned his half to the club. Thank you, John!

Presentation: Mark, N6ARP, gave an interesting presentation on DMR-Digital Mobile Radio. DMR was developed by the European Telecommunication Standards Institute with the objective of digital voice communications. It has several benefits:

- Two simultaneous voice conversations on a single repeater
- Improved audio performance
- More efficient use of the radio spectrum (12.5 KHz channel width)
- Text messaging
- Longer battery life
- Compares favorably or is more advantageous than other digital voice modes, e.g., DStar, Fusion, NXON/DIS, and P25 Phase II

DMR utilizes Talk Groups, which are virtual radio channels assigned by geography or language. All radios must be registered with a 7-digit DMR ID. Currently there are 6,578 repeaters worldwide and 4.360 million registered radio ID's worldwide.

He looked very much like an FCC guy, Who'd come to check up on some bad TVI.


I shouted to him, "OM! QRZ?"
