President Mark, N6ARP, called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm, welcomed everyone and asked Herb, W9CMX, to lead the Pledge of Allegiance. There were 32 members present according to the sign-in sheet. Mark asked members and guests to introduce themselves.

Reading of Minutes: Secretary Scott, N6CIC, reported the Readout with the minutes that had been e-mailed out to the membership prior to the meeting. Dick, W8AAL made a motion to approve the minutes, with a second by Eva, KM6BIP. The club approved the minutes unanimously.

Vice-President Scott, KN6OOV, reported that a presentation was needed for October. John, K6JRO, volunteered to give a presentation on the California QSO Party that he and Brendon, NK6M, will participate in during the first weekend in October.

Treasurer Scott, KN6RKY, read the current treasurer's report. A copy is attached to the minutes and will be included in the next Readout. He noted that we now have 77 members in the club. He thanked Zack, KI6KQO, for his donation to the club of \$370 which included covering the deficit of the

We are taking membership applications for 2023. One-year dues are \$30.00 for individuals, or \$45.00 for a family. To join, fill out the registration form in this newsletter and bring it to any SARA meeting.

Stan/Joaquin Hamfest and for his appreciation of the club. Bill, AE6J, made a motion to accept the report. After a second by John, K6JRO, the club approved the treasurer's report.

Sergeant at Arms Herb, W9CMX had snacks, water, and coffee available for the break, and said there will be a 50:50 raffle after the break to include SARA Club key chains and an amateur radio operator's hat.

Club Trustee Lucian, KF6NPG, reported he has received no equipment complaints, and the repeater system is working except for the Yaesu 440 Fusion repeater. The repeater was sent to Yaesu for repair. Repairs should be completed by sometime in July. We still need to find a tower climber to repair the VHF antenna bracket. Lucian will be checking with 10-4 for a quote.

The packet antenna was replaced and both antenna brackets were painted. Lucian was unable to upgrade the grounding as the lock was changed on the south door of the building.

The electric bill spiked last month to \$124, and Lucian will be monitoring to see if it remains this high or if it levels out. PG&E costs have gone up about 20%. The committee continues to evaluate solar charging; however, plans are on hold until the costs of repairing the VHF antenna are determined.

While at the site, Lucian tried to set up the ARES portable 440 repeater Ion QSO, however it would not work due to a variety of issues at the site, even though it works in his home. While at the site he installed a small fan on the VHF repeater. Since we cannot afford AC for the building, we will install more small fans and are looking at a solar exhaust fan.

Board Members: Randy, KF6RJS, Jason, KA6TIO, and Richard, W8AAL, were present: Jason will give a presentation on Field Day (below). Randy, KF6RJS, gave an update on the weather.

ARES: Ed, KF6FIR, reported on the EMCOMM workshop, and the Section Manager has requested a summary of Field Day activities be sent to the section.

Community Events: Lucian, KF6NPG, reported the Snelling Road Race took place on June 8 with pleasantly cool weather. Lucian thanked the club members who participated in providing communication for the event.

Old Business:

All-Mode Net: Mark reported that Art, KN6SSP, will continue as Net Control.

New Business: None

Break:

There was a 15-minute break. The Split-the-Pot raffle raised \$200. Dick, W8AAL, was the lucky winner, and he donated his half back to the club. Thank you, Dick! Lucian, KF6NPG, won the hat, and Mark, N6ARP, and Vicki, KJ6RCV, won the key chains.

Presentation: Jason, KA6TIO, gave a presentation on Field Day. The ARRL started Field Day in 1933 with the objective of testing portable activity

ARRL EC-001 course

Ham Cram Information

ARRL EC-001 Emergency Communications Course

If you need to take the ARRL Emergency Communications Course (EC-001) Stanislaus ARES can help. The EC-001 workbook is out of print, however The Indian River County ARES has all of the study information (including test and answers) posted on their web site. Recent amateurs who have taken the test have printed out the test questions and answers and have studied like they would for a ham cram. Pass rate has been about 100 percent.

The ARRL has updated this course. There are some content differences, however members who have used this to prepare for the challenge exam have been successful.

Here is the web site to study for the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications Course challenge examination (EC-001):

Go to www.ircares.org This is the web site for the Indian River County ARES. Once you are on the web site click on the training and reference tab. Then click on the ARRL Introduction to Emergency Communications (EC-001) tab. That will take you to the course information.

Once you complete this on-line study you can arrange with Stanislaus ARES to take the ARRL test. We generally give the test at a ham cram session or before or after the monthly ARES meeting. Please e-mail Lucian, KF6NPG at kf6npg@aol.com or John, K6JRO at k6jro@arrl.net to arrange to take the test.

There is a \$15.00 test administration fee payable to ARRL.

You can also access the updated ARRL EC-001 course at the ARRL website. Go to www.arrl.org. Once there click on the licensing, education and training tab. Then click on the online course catalog tab and

look for the EC-001 course. It states that it takes about 45 hours to complete the course over 9 weeks. Once you complete the ARRL course you can take the exam online. From what I can see there is no charge to take the course or exam. You must take the course before you can take the exam.

You cannot take the challenge exam online.
