Weather report from Randy, KF6RJS

The following report was filed by SARA club weather officer Randy, KF6RJS. Data was collected from his home QTH in North Modesto:

In January I had 0.40" for the month and for the year I am at 4.11". So far this month I have had 4 days of rain. The biggest rain I had was on Tuesday February 4th where I had 0.70" inches. So far this month it is 1.02". For the year I am at 5.13" of rain. I don't know if we will make 15.52" of last year. We would have to makeup 10.39". But we will see. No more rain is forecasted after this rain this weekend. Monday the 17th thru Friday the 21st 62 to 65 for high's and 42 thru 47 for low's and partly cloudy. There is a 10% change of rain on Thursday the 20th.

Final storm totals for this past week: Wednesday 0.30", Thursday 1.4", and Friday 0.04". Total for the week was 1.74" which brings our monthly total to 2.76". Currently yearly total is 7.89". Highest wind gust this week was Thursday with a high gust of 27.0mph.
